The TMIP has a strong commitment to assist Texas home-based migrant students in activities aimed at increasing the number of students being served in out-of-state migrant programs and to increase the graduation rate. It is through these coordination efforts that we attempt to minimize educational interruption.

Intra- and interstate coordination provides TMIP and receiving states' educational entities the opportunity to address issues that pertain to appropriate course placement, consolidation of partial credits, and credit accrual. These efforts play a key role in providing the best opportunities for our shared migrant students to succeed in school. The TMIP staff works with receiving states and Texas schools so that our shared migrant students have the most opportunities to achieve educational success.

New Director for IL MEP

Susana DasNeves serves as the new director for the coordination of Migrant Education Services in Illinois at Northern Illinois University (NIU) where she has been serving students and

the community as a bilingual counselor, academic advisor, and administrator in student and academic affairs at the university and community college levels. Through the years she has developed partnerships with colleagues and community organizations to provide all students a smooth transition to post-secondary education. Susana's first experience with Migrant Education took place in the early 1990s while attending The University of Tennessee Knoxville and became involved with the Highlander Center in New Market, TN; she then moved to Illinois and connected with Rochelle MEP and facilitated parent night sessions and instituted the "Night Owl" College Visit to NIU for secondary youth. She then supported the statewide workshop as a breakout session facilitator and presenter at parent regional workshops. Prior to her appointment as Director of IL Migrant Services at NIU (IMES-NIU) she served as Program Coordinator for Parent University, a community outreach initiative that aims to empower Latino Parents as Adult Learners. Susana also serves as Vice President of Education and Professional Development for the Illinois Latino Council on Higher Education executive board. She is excited to explore the opportunities Northern Illinois University can bring to the IL Migrant Education Program.
