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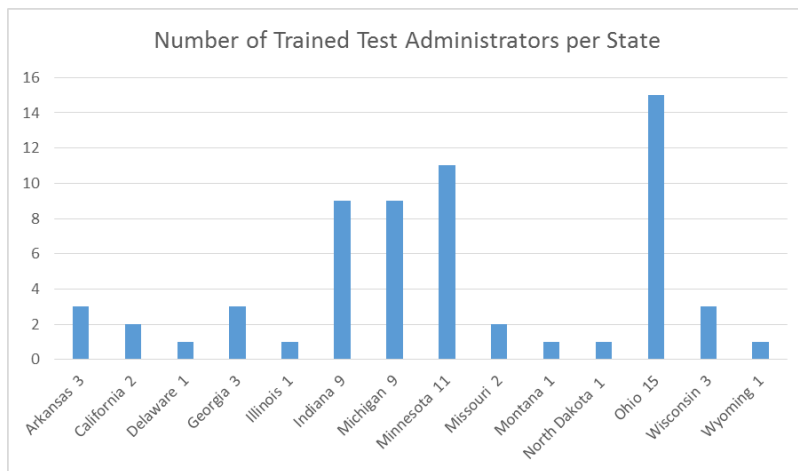
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TMIP and Our Shared Migrant Students

The TMIP makes every effort to ensure migrant students are offered the same testing opportunities as their non migrant peers. The TMIP trains test administrators in numerous states, in the event that migrant students need testing in their state (STAAR, TAKS). The chart below reflects the number of trained test administrators per state for the school year 2015-2016. Students who are eligible to test and are in a non-testing state or a state that only test TAKS, the TMIP will attempt to coordinate with a nearby testing state.

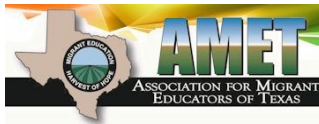
Nomination Criteria:

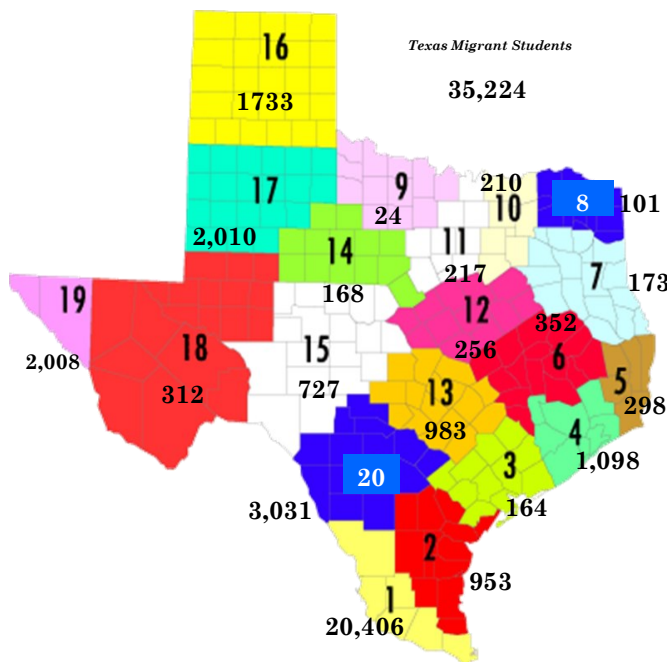
2016 Exemplary Migrant Student
